The Mistake Room: A New Art Space On L.A.'s Cultural Horizon

L.A. has an exciting newcomer on our art scene. The Mistake Room is more than just a quirky name. It is an art space dedicated “solely... to an international program of contemporary art and thought.” The space sets out to examine human creativity through exhibits, academic research, publications, and more, exposing Los Angeles audiences to a broad range of international artists, both emerging and established.

Located in Downtown L.A., The Mistake Room opens its inaugural exhibit, Oscar Murillo: Distribution Center, next week. From The Mistake Room's Facebook page:

Informed by charged histories that trace the social, political and cultural implications resulting from the movement of bodies, capital and commodities across geographies, Murillo brings to Los Angeles

an ambitious multi-faceted project that takes over an entire derelict building in the heart of the city's downtown creative industrial center. Weaving together the various aspects of his practice and exposing the processes of production of both his studio and a candy manufacturing factory in his native Colombia, Murillo will ask us to question the mythologies of social mobility and economic advancement that fuel the migrant dream of diasporic people around the world and the urgency for a renewed relationship between labor and aesthetics. This exhibition marks Murillo's first institutional solo show in the United States and the inauguration of The Mistake Room.
